The directors of Harvey Nash and London Business School's Leadership Institute have conducted their fourth annual research into the changing dynamics of boards in the UK, Europe and Asia Pac, and will be publishing the findings at the London Business School on 14 November 2017.

This year's Annual Board Research has extended its scope and builds on the previous three reports that provided interesting insights into the increasingly challenging demands placed on Boards, Chairs and Non-Executives as the digital, political and business agenda impacts on organisations and their ability to perform. This year's research adds to this theme, is informative and will provide the basis of debate and lively discussion.

We are delighted and honoured to have Rachel Lomax as our guest speaker to comment on the research and lead the evening's debate. Rachel is a British economist, banker, and former government official. She has experience in the public and private sectors, plus a deep knowledge of the operations of the UK government and financial system. Her previous appointments include Deputy Governor, Monetary Stability, at the Bank of England (BoE) and a member of the BoE's Monetary Policy Committee; Permanent Secretary at the UK Government Departments for Transport and Work and Pensions and the Welsh Office; and Vice President and Chief of Staff to the President of the World Bank. Rachel has extensive non-executive experience, having served on a number of different kinds of boards, both public and private. Her current portfolio includes Heathrow Airport, Serco and SETL, as well as Breugel, Imperial College and Ditchley Park. Previous non-executive appointments have included HSBC Holdings where she was Senior Independent director until May this year, and RGA, the US reinsurance company. She has also been on the board of City UK and chaired the IRSG.

The evening will be an excellent opportunity to hear first-hand the keynotes and commentary of our research, network with your board-level peers and contribute to the discussion.
